3. The mark of universal scorn his Master stood, nor hid his face; like one deserted and forlorn he seemed: by all accounted base.

4. The liker to their Master here, the more abundant joy they prove: a joy, though not unmixed with fear, yet full of sweetness, full of love.

5. Then make us like thyself, O Lord; as thou wert, let thy people be: we look above for our reward; we look to reign in heav'n with thee.
